SicklepodSenna obtusifolia

Sicklepod is declared a Class B (growth and spread to be controlled) and Class C (not to be introduced) weed in the Northern Territory

Sicklepod is a declared weed in accordance with the *Weed Management Act*.

HABIT

Invades disturbed areas and along rivers and floodplains.

STEMS & BRANCHES



Annual or short-lived perennial shrub which grows to 2m.

LEAVES



Leaves are divided into 3 pairs of opposite leaflets. Leaflets are green and are usually 2 - 3cm long and 1.5 - 2cm wide.

FLOWERS



Pea-type flowers are yellow with 5 petals 1cm wide. Flowers grow in pairs.

FRUIT & SEEDS



Seed pods are bean-like and grow to 10cm long and 10mm wide. Pods grow downwards from the stem. Seeds are flattened and dark brown.
